A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 2 traffic, so as to create a new class of motor vehicles to be known as personal transportation
- 3 vehicles; to provide for a definition; to provide for rights and duties of drivers of personal
- 4 transportation vehicles; to provide for rules of the road; to provide for local ordinances
- 5 regulating personal transportation vehicles; to provide for operation of such vehicles on the
- 6 public highways; to provide for permits in certain situations; to provide for related matters;
- 7 to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

9 **SECTION 1.**

- 10 Title 40 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to motor vehicles and traffic, is
- amended by adding a new paragraph to Code Section 40-1-1, relating to definitions regarding
- 12 motor vehicles and traffic, as follows:
- 13 "(43.1) 'Personal transportation vehicle' means any motor vehicle:
- 14 (A) With a minimum of four wheels;
- 15 (B) Capable of a maximum level ground speed of less than 20 miles per hour;
- 16 (C) With a maximum gross vehicle unladen or empty weight of 1,375 pounds; and
- 17 (D) Capable of transporting not more than eight persons."

18 SECTION 2.

- 19 Said title is further amended by adding a new part to Article 13 of Chapter 6, relating to
- 20 special provisions for certain vehicles, to read as follows:
- 21 "<u>Part 6</u>
- <u>40-6-363.</u>
- 23 (a) In addition to the requirements contained in paragraph (43.1) of Code Section 40-1-1,
- 24 <u>all personal transportation vehicles shall have the following equipment:</u>
- 25 (1) A parking brake;

26 (2) A reverse warning device functional at all times when the directional control is in the

- 27 <u>reverse position;</u>
- 28 (3) A main power switch. When the switch is in the 'off' position, or the key or other
- 29 <u>device that activates the switch is removed, the motive power circuit shall be inoperative.</u>
- 30 <u>If the switch uses a key, it shall be removable only in the 'off' position;</u>
- 31 (4) Head lamps;
- 32 <u>(5) Reflex reflectors;</u>
- 33 <u>(6) Tail lamps;</u>
- 34 <u>(7) A horn;</u>
- 35 (8) Safety warning labels; and
- 36 (9) Hip restraints and hand holds.
- 37 (b) A local governing authority may allow vehicles manufactured before January 1, 2012,
- 38 that are currently or have previously been registered with the local governing authority and
- 39 are not equipped with head lamps, reflex reflectors, or a horn to qualify as a personal
- 40 <u>transport vehicle.</u>
- 41 <u>40-6-364.</u>
- 42 Every person operating a personal transportation vehicle shall be granted all the rights and
- 43 <u>shall be subject to all the duties applicable to the driver of any other vehicle under this</u>
- 44 <u>chapter unless such rights are expressly prohibited or qualified by a local ordinance, except</u>
- 45 <u>as to special regulations in this part, and except as to those provisions of this chapter which</u>
- by their nature can have no application.

- 48 (a) All personal transportation vehicles are entitled to full use of a lane, and no motor
- 49 <u>vehicle shall be driven in such a manner as to deprive any personal transportation vehicle</u>
- of the full use of a lane.
- 51 (b) The operator of a personal transportation vehicle shall not overtake and pass in the
- 52 <u>same lane occupied by the vehicle being overtaken.</u>
- 53 (c) No person shall operate a personal transportation vehicle between lanes of traffic or
- 54 <u>between adjacent lines or rows of vehicles.</u>
- 55 (d) Personal transportation vehicles shall not be operated two or more abreast in a single
- 56 <u>lane.</u>

- 58 A local governing authority may adopt by ordinance traffic regulations regulating the use

- shall not conflict with or duplicate state law.

- 63 (a) As used in this Code section, the term 'highway,' as defined in paragraph (19) of Code
- 64 <u>Section 40-1-1, means a state controlled highway.</u>
- 65 (b) Personal transportation vehicles shall be operated only on any highway where the
- 66 posted speed limit does not exceed 25 miles per hour. The operator of a personal
- 67 <u>transportation vehicle shall not operate such vehicle on any highway where the posted</u>
- speed limit exceeds 25 miles per hour.
- 69 <u>40-6-368.</u>
- 70 The owner of a personal transportation vehicle may be required to obtain a permit from the
- 71 Department of Driver Services or a local governing authority which allows the owner, or
- an operator authorized by the owner, to:
- 73 (1) Operate the personal transportation vehicle on a roadway or street; and
- 74 (2) Cross a state controlled highway while traveling along a street or roadway only at
- 75 <u>crossings or intersections designated for that purpose by the Department of</u>
- 76 Transportation.
- Such permits shall be issued only upon payment of a fee and upon proof of financial
- 78 <u>responsibility of the owner of the personal transportation vehicle. An appropriate</u>
- 79 <u>identification label shall be issued to the owner of the personal transportation vehicle."</u>

SECTION 3.

81 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
